The organisation which started in 1989, has as its president Lennox Simon, they have adopted 7 schools and have since over the years been assisting by donating school supplies, these schools are Cane End Government, Evesham Methodist, Barrouallie Anglican, Rose Hall Govt, Layou Govt, Sandy Bay Primary and Mary Hutchinson Union Island, which they annually sent supplies for annually.
